How to get there?

canal du Midi

On the D51E5 between Marseillan Plage and Marseillan Ville, the walk starts on the left bank of the Canal du Midi. This path is accessible beside the bridge.

Mont Saint Loup

On the D612, take direction Cap d'Agde, then D32E10 (Agde Centre) and at the roundabout, first road on the right. Parking is available opposite the restaurant « La Baraka ».

Observation area

On the D51E5 between Marseillan Plage and Marseillan Ville, after crossing the Canal du Midi, stay on the main road. The Observation Area is indicated by a sign on your left side.

Onglous Lighthouse

On the D51E5 between Marseillan Plage and Marseillan Ville, go over the brigde, pick up the cycle track and take the right path along the D51E6. Parking available near the bus stop.

Domaine of Maraval

This is accessible by bicycle from the Maison de la Reserve, following the cycle track. Also, parking is available before the entrance to the naturist village at Cap d'Agde.




At the head of the Onglous, fresh water from the Canal du Midi and salt water from the **Thau lagoon** meet.
